Can you use adjectives to describe? Think of a list of adjectives to describe a hot air balloon scene. Can you put these adjectives into sentences?

Reading - develop a love for reading a range of different texts. Read a poem or story about the sky. What did you like about it most and why? Write about it in your homework book. Try to include connectives like 'and', 'so' and 'but'.

Maths

Practise writing numbers 1-20 in both digits and words e.g. 1, one - can you spell them correctly?
Money - Can you recognise different coins? Look at the price of different items in a shop. What different coins might be needed? Perhaps you could have a go at paying for something using the correct amount.
Counting - Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s.

Music/Science

Reuse everyday objects (e.g. plastic bottles, cereal boxes) to make a musical instrument. Draw or take a photo of your instrument and label the materials used. Perhaps you can bring it in to show the class!



Art / DT

Choose a window in your home and draw the view you see. Can you see the sky?



Can you design and make a flying machine from everyday materials?

PSHE

Create a new playground game. What are the rules? Write a list of instructions so we know how to play.

ICT/ PSHE

Create an e-safety poster that shares rules of how to be safe online.
